CASE MANAGEMENT ORDER NO. 31

(Fourteenth Case Management Conference)

(Applies to All Actions)

The Court held a Fourteenth Case Management Conference with the parties on February 20, 2025. *See* Doc. 2666. This order reflects matters discussed and decided during the conference.

- 1. The Court will hold a Fifteenth Case Management Conference on March 20, 2025 at 2:00 p.m. Arizona time. The conference will be held by Zoom. By close of business on March 18, 2025, the parties shall file a joint memorandum. The joint memorandum shall include a proposed schedule for bellwether-specific fact discovery, bellwether-specific expert discovery, motions to exclude bellwether-specific experts, and motions for summary judgment in the six bellwether cases.
- 2. The Court discussed with the parties a number of issues raised in the parties' joint memorandum. Doc. 2638. These include a potential replacement Plaintiff in Discovery Group 1, Defendants' supplemental production of documents, Defendants' responses to Plaintiffs' third set of interrogatories, Defendants' responses to Plaintiffs'

deposition on written questions, Defendants' supplementation of their responses to Plaintiffs' second set of interrogatories, the completion of common-issue depositions, and Defendants' recent subpoenas. The parties are working productively to resolve any issues related to these subjects.

- 3. The parties are in the process of completing Plaintiff-related depositions, treating physician depositions, and the depositions of sales representatives for Discovery Group 1. The Court stated that Plaintiffs' counsel have the right to attend the depositions of sales representatives in person, and the parties should confer in good faith on any issues related to such personal appearances.
- 4. The Court will issue an order to show cause with respect to Janie Withrow, 24-cv-03356, for failure to produce a Plaintiff Profile Form despite clear requirements in the Court's orders and deficiency letters from defense counsel.
- 5. The parties' memorandum identifies 17 Plaintiffs with deficient Plaintiff Profile Forms, but the parties reported that defense counsel have heard from counsel for each of these Plaintiffs and that the issues are being resolved.
- 6. The Court previously issued an Order to Show Cause with respect to six Plaintiffs. Doc. 2368. Five of these Plaintiffs have responded and shown that they have now served a Plaintiff Profile Form, and Defendants have withdrawn their requests for dismissal. Defendants nonetheless seek to recover attorneys' fees for the time incurred in obtaining Plaintiff Profile Forms from these individual Plaintiffs. The Court directed defense counsel to file a motion for attorneys' fees that specifies the fees sought with respect to each Plaintiff and whether the fees are sought from Plaintiffs' counsel. The Court will resolve this issue after briefing is completed.
- 7. Plaintiff Capricia Parker, 24-cv-2615, has failed to serve a Plaintiff Profile Form in response to the Order to Show Cause. Her form has been due for several months, and she has not served it despite repeated requests from defense counsel. Consistent with CMO 8, the Court will dismiss Plaintiff Parker's complaint with prejudice for failure to follow Court orders.

- 8. Plaintiffs identified 18 cases in which Defendants have not produced complaint files as required in section V(2) of the Defendant Profile Form. Defendants shall provide the complaint files in those cases by the next case management conference.
- 9. The parties are continuing to meet and confer regarding issues related to Defendant Fact Sheets. They should contact the Court if any issues arise.
